Tours begin at Bank Junction and end at Farringdon Station
£8.00 per person, £7.00 for concessions (60+); £6.00 for The Postal
Museum Members. Free for accompanied children under 12 years old.

Join an accredited guide for a walking tour through 350 years of London
Postal History – from the Coffee Houses of the 1600s to the electronic
communications of today. Discover why pillar boxes are coloured red, why the
post is called the ‘post’ and the mail is called the ‘mail’, and why the floors of
all telephone boxes slope.

All GPO walking tours are led by trained and accredited guides for Clerkenwell
and Islington, and the City of London.

Walks start at Bank Junction (on the steps of the Royal Exchange) near to
Bank Underground station. The walks last for around 2 hours and will end at
Farringdon Station – after which the guide will lead people to The Postal
Museum, about 12 minutes’ walk away.
